

Preventive Medicine & Population Health Attendance Policy

Attendance Policy 2015-2016

School of Medicine Dean's Office policy for 2015-2016 regarding attendance states:

- *Students who miss a clerkship orientation without making prior arrangements with the Clerkship Director will not be permitted to begin the clerkship.*
- *Students who miss one week of a 4-week clerkship must repeat the entire clerkship, regardless of the reason.*
- *Students may not use more than 4 days for interviewing.*

Required:

Orientation
Introduction to Quality Improvement
Motivational Interviewing Review
Organizational Change and Data Analysis
Clinical Preventive Medicine
Final exam/project presentations
OSCE

On-site half-day activities: Lifestyle Medicine (CHIP), SACHS, Smoking Clinic.

Reading/Viewing: Association for Prevention Teaching and Research modules; Institute for Healthcare Improvement.

Two Population Health video documentaries; one book or two documentaries

Students may be excused for interviews, national examinations or medical conference attendance, from the following:

- 3 selective half-days (1.5 days)
- 3 project half-days (1.5 days)
- 1 Friday didactic day (1 day)

Other Appointments: Any exceptions to the above attendance requirements must be approved by the Course Director; if an appointment for a reason other than those above is needed, the student must contact Course Coordinator at least 5 working days (Mon-Fri) before that appointment.
